The format of the Sydney Dialogue is also a first. It will see a two-year journey designed to create lasting impact, combining virtual and in-person events and a year-long group collaboration.

Discussions will be facilitated through GAP's Second Track process – an innovative approach to group collaboration focusing on positive thinking, long-term engagement, and personal interest in achieving results.
