Topics for Discussion

Session One – Decision Making in Uncertain Times

- What are the current challenges facing democratic processes in decision making?

Session Two – Democracy in the Digital Age

- How can we manage the benefits and risks of digital tools in democratic decision making?
- With the release of powerful new AI technologies that have quickly gained hundreds of millions of users, what might be the influence of these, combined with immersive tech and social media, on decision-making processes?
- What forms of governance help support long-term decision making around complex issues?

Session Three - The Future of Decision Making

- What kinds of engagement models are best suited to dealing with wicked problems and grand challenges?
- How can deliberative processes help navigate polarisation?
- How can we encourage young people to contribute to decision making today?
